ASGPP Research Grants: Applications by January 31st, 2020

On May 25th, 2012, Erica Hollander, PhD, JD, TEP and Nancy Kirsner, PhD, TEP, started a Research Fund, restricted to the specific purpose of supporting research in Psychodrama, Sociometry, and Group Psychotherapy by members of ASGPP who are at least certified at the CP level. The money is to be distributed on the basis of competitive applications by those eligible, to be weighed by a review committee

The Research Fund Review Committee is now accepting the first round of grant applications. The committee will consider and weigh applications for research design. Recipients of support will be required by contract to present progress reports on the research at the 2021 ASGPP conference, attending the conference at the researcher's own expense. Any publications to which supported research contributes should acknowledge ASGPP support.
